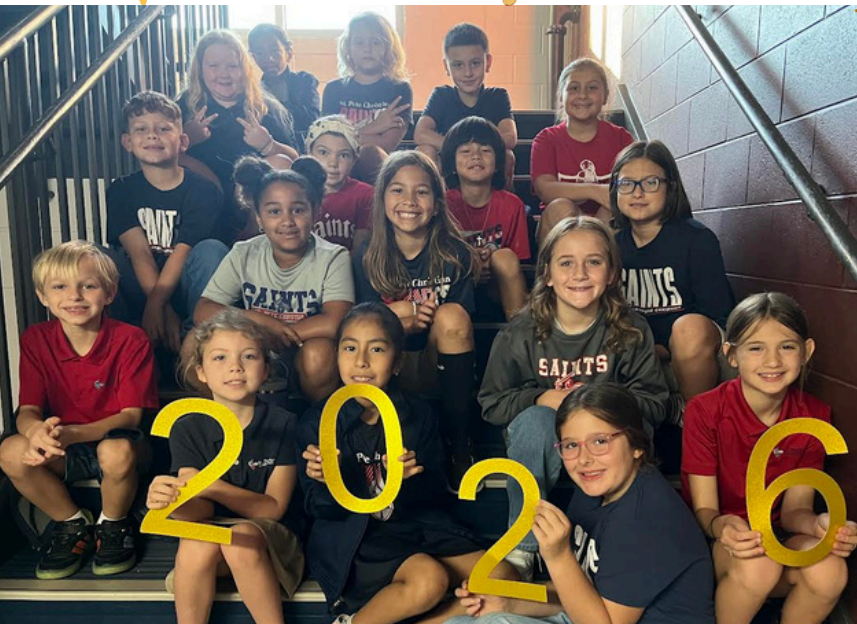

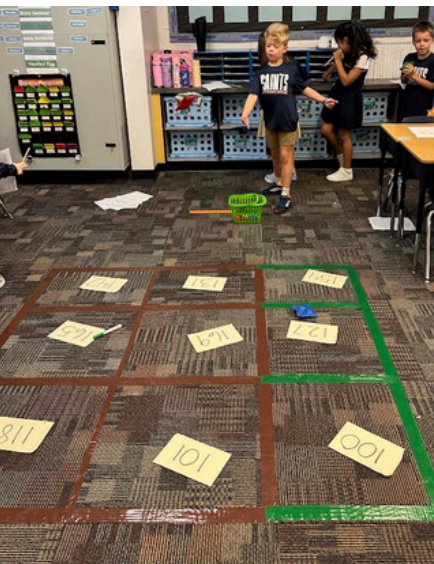

MIDDLE SCHOOL ALGEBRA

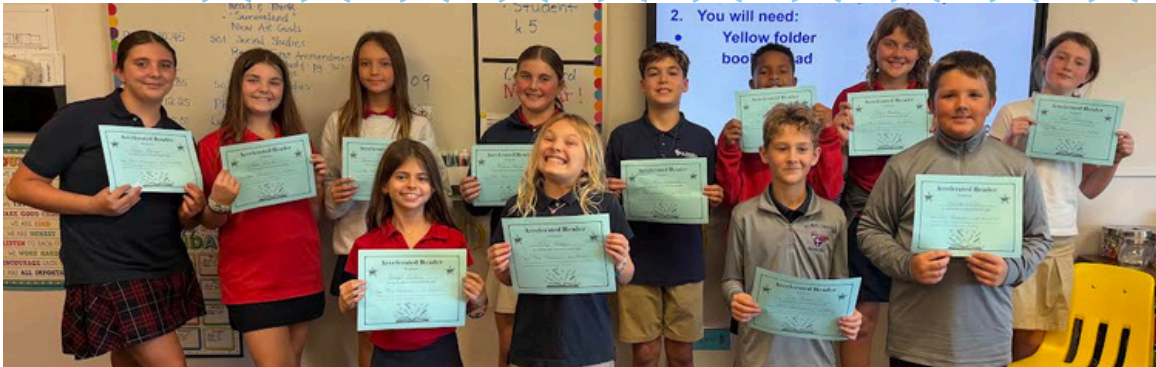
Algebra students reviewed linear equations today. They worked in groups to match slopes from tables, graphs, and equations.

$$y = mx + b$$



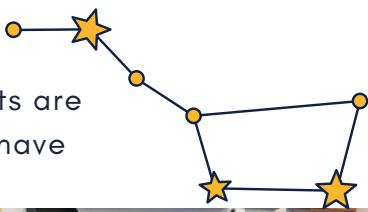
5TH GRADE READING ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★
