
3RD GRADE GUEST SPEAKER


1ST GRADE FUN

Whether it is in the classroom or out at recess, there is always something fun to do in First Grade!




5TH GRADE SOCIAL STUDIES




For more review, they also used Kahoot. This fun, interactive game helps them practice key concepts while also keeping them engaged and excited about their learning.

Elementary students enjoy visiting the Makerspace Lab every other week during their Library time.




2ND GRADE RAINY DAY




SOCCER
