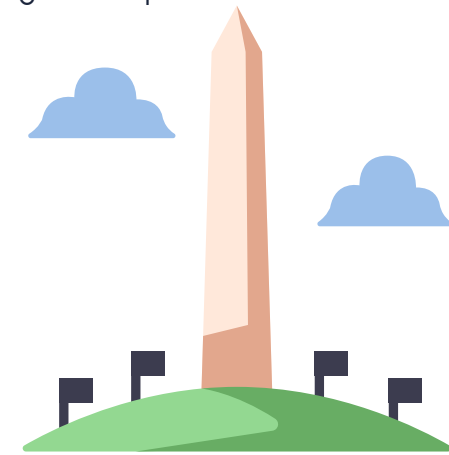

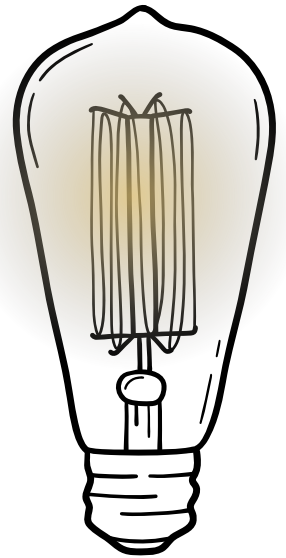
8TH GRADE VISITS WASHINGTON DC

Students that raised at least \$100 at the 2023 Fun Run were treated to adventure and fun at Skyzone this week! Everyone had a great time!

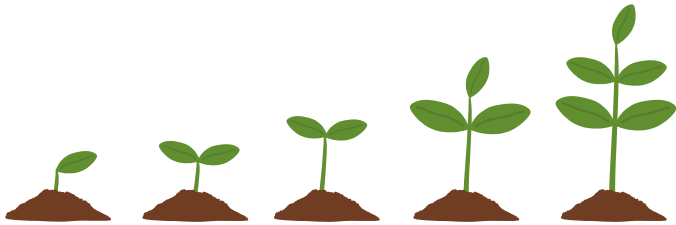






2ND GRADE SCIENCE
