KINDERGARTEN PUMPKIN TASTING


Miss Dorsett's class created tally charts to track their ratings of pumpkin-flavored foods. It was a "sweet" lesson!

The sunny day brought Mrs. Hudzina's class outdoors to The SPOT for a Language Arts lesson!








1ST GRADE NEWS



Our 7th graders participated in a hands-on dissection learning about the sea star, more commonly known as starfish, and their anatomy. As our students progress in their biology studies, they work with partners to view how each animal group has similarities and differences to others we've studied. They continue their work on invertebrates as we explore more complex organisms in this kingdom and phylum with their unique body systems. These labs allow our scholars to discover the complexity of God's creatures.











6TH GRADE SCIENCE








COMPUTER CLASS
